McCormack U.S. Post Office and Courthouse located at 5 Post Office Square in Boston, Massachusetts at a design cost of \$721,000, an estimated construction cost of \$9,218,000 and a management and inspection cost of \$812,000 for a total estimated project cost of \$10,751,000, a description of which is attached hereto and by reference made part of this resolution, is approved.
