RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON ENVIRONMENT AND PUBLIC WORKS OF THE UNITED STATES SENATE

that pursuant to title 40 U.S.C. § 3307, appropriations are authorized for the construction of facilities of 404,026 gross square feet (including canopies and structured parking) to modernize and expand the Otay Mesa Land Port of Entry including expansion of the pedestrian processing facilities, construction of a commercial annex building, relocation of detention and Secure Electronic Network for Travelers Rapid Inspection (SENTRI) facilities and hazardous material processing, construction of surface or structured parking for employees and visitors, additional non-commercial primary inspection booths, and commercial import lot improvements at the Otay Mesa U.S. Land Port of Entry located in San Diego, California at an additional design cost of \$10,062,000, an estimated construction cost of \$100,718,000 and a management and inspection cost of \$11,068,000 for a total of \$121,848,000, which is in addition to funds provided pursuant to Public Law 111-5, a prospectus for which is attached hereto and by reference made part of this resolution, is approved.

Provided, that the Administrator shall provide to the Chairman or Ranking Member of the Committee on Environment and Public Works of the Senate, in a timely manner, requested documents and information regarding this prospectus and resulting contractual materials, without redaction other than redactions to exclude business confidential, proprietary, and/or procurement sensitive information.

Provided further, that the Administrator shall not delegate to any other agency the authority granted by this resolution.
