GSA's Federal Surplus Personal Property Donation Program enables non-profit organizations and eligible institutions, including **Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs)**, **Tribal Colleges and Universities (TCUs)**, **Hispanic Serving Institutions (HSIs)** and **Minority Service Institutions (MSIs)** to obtain surplus property from the Federal Government.

GSA Federal Surplus Personal Property Donation Program

THE SURPLUS DONATION PROGRAM

enables certain non-federal organizations such as state and local agencies and non-profit organizations to obtain surplus property from the Federal Government. The program ensures that assets no longer needed by the government continue to benefit the public in communities across the country. The goal of the GSA Office of Personal Property Management is to ensure diversity, equity, inclusion, and accessibility in the program by raising awareness, reducing barriers, and ensuring equal access for underserved communities.

Eligibility

- Non-profit educational institutions
 - Schools
 - Historically Black Colleges and Universities, Hispanic Serving Institutions, Tribal Colleges and Universities, and other Minority Serving Institutions
- Public Agencies

Available surplus property includes:

- Computers and electronics
- Office machines and supplies
- Furniture
- Construction equipment and machine tools
- Appliances and hardware
- Medical supplies and equipment
- Science and lab equipment
- Motor vehicles, boats, airplanes, and much more
