Relief Efforts for Hurricane Florence

1. Purpose.

Hurricane Florence has been declared an emergency by the President (see EM-3400, EM-3401, and EM-3403 on the <u>FEMA Disaster Declarations</u> webpage). GSA anticipates being part of the response operation. Many GSA contracting officers may be called on to aid in response and/or recovery efforts. The following information is provided to assist the Heads of Contracting Activities (HCAs) and contracting officers actively responding in providing relief efforts to Hurricane Florence.

2. Contract and Lease Flexibilities.

In accordance with GSA's FAR Class Deviation - Exercise of Special Emergency Procurement Authorities (see <u>Acquisition Letter MV-17-03</u>), the emergency acquisition flexibilities listed in <u>FAR Subpart 18.2</u> are available for use along with the existing acquisition flexibilities enumerated in <u>FAR Subpart 18.1</u>. This memorandum focuses on the flexibilities in <u>FAR Subpart 18.2</u>, but as a reminder, the flexibilities in <u>FAR Subpart 18.1</u> apply to any emergency situation, both with and without a major disaster or emergency declaration. Further information on emergency acquisition is now available on the Acquisition Portal Emergency Acquisitions Website.

For direct purposes of the response to Hurricane Florence:

 The micropurchase threshold is increased to \$20,000 for any contract to be awarded and performed, or purchase to be made in support of the designated areas. The Davis-Bacon and Service Contract Act (SCA) thresholds are not changed.

- The <u>simplified acquisition threshold (SAT) is increased to \$750,000</u>, or \$13,000,000 for commercial items, for any contract to be awarded and performed, or purchased in support of the designated areas, including the acquisition of leasehold interests in real property.
- The additional flexibilities of FAR Subpart 18.2 cannot be used for any other acquisition, including depot back-fills. The threshold increases are specific only to support the designated areas. We expect the designated areas to be revised as the storm moves. As the geographic area of the Presidential declaration is revised (see EM-3400, EM-3401, and EM-3403 on the <u>FEMA Disaster Declarations</u> webpage), the geographic area applicable to the threshold increases in this memorandum is simultaneously revised without the need for a revision to this memorandum.

The threshold increases will remain in effect until January 31, 2019, unless otherwise rescinded, modified or extended.

3. FPDS Reporting.

GSA added a new National Interest Action (NIA) to the NIA field in FPDS as a means of tracking acquisition costs of the multiple Federal agencies involved in Hurricane Florence, an incident of great national interest. This new NIA Code shall be used strictly for reporting purposes related to Hurricane Florence and involves the exercise of the emergency authorities identified in FAR Subpart 18.2, Emergency Acquisition Flexibilities. FPDS system details for this NIA follow:

4. Additional Guidance.
