Current Offerings

Our Workplace 2030 initiative brings innovative tools and services to the federal government.

Commercial Coworking

Agencies access on-demand, turnkey coworking spaces for individual employees or large groups through a GSA contract with five private-sector coworking providers.

Workplace Engagements

Studies and activities that holistically evaluate human, space and technology workplace needs. GSA in-house and contracted services can inform portfolio strategy, prepare occupancy requirements, provide change management consulting, and more.

Workplace Investment & Feasibility Modeling Tool

A do-it-yourself tool to explore workplace scenarios based on projected telework participation levels.

Workplace Innovation Lab

A proving ground for the latest workplace technologies, equipment, and furniture set in a federal coworking space at GSA Headquarters.





Emerging Solutions

GSA is piloting and prototyping more Workplace 2030 offerings.

- **Federal Coworking:** On-demand coworking space in existing GSA leases and owned buildings, rather than in private-sector coworking environments.
- **Fast Track Space:** Agencies choose from pre-packaged space designs, concept models and square footages to fit their needs.
- **Federal Space Listing:** A web-based tool listing GSA's vacant owned and leased space for customer agencies to facilitate consolidation and expansion opportunity discussions.

Hybrid Works

Work activities completed in general office space can be a great fit for hybrid work solutions. When employees can effectively work away from a primary job site and agency space is designed accordingly, the federal government's real estate needs will shrink. Of course, in-office work continues to be important for human connection and functions like law enforcement, working with secure information, and other tasks tied to special space. GSA can help agencies analyze work activities and plan the right mix of centralized office, mobility and innovative space.
